As part of the Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Disability Employment Awareness Month activities, the Department will host several events. These events will be held on October 22 in Beltsville, Maryland, on November 4 at the Whitten Patio in Washington, DC, and in January 2010 at the Riverdale Center in Maryland. This month is an especially appropriate time to celebrate the AbilityOne Program and recognize the talents, skills, and dedication of those Americans who are blind or have other severe disabilities.

The AbilityOne Program provides a wide range of professional and business support services. Currently, USDA has contracted with AbilityOne non-profit agencies for mailroom, administrative and custodial services, secure document destruction, and publication distribution. The AbilityOne Program also has the capability to provide a variety of other services, such as secure mail/digital document services, switchboard and call center operation, vehicle maintenance and management, and warehousing/distribution. Products available under the AbilityOne Program include a wide range of office supplies, "green" cleaning products, hardware items, medical/surgical products, and textiles.

All USDA purchase card users and acquisition personnel should make AbilityOne their first stop when purchasing supplies and services.
